



DEVELOPMENT CLINIC VENUE AND ACTIVITY CHECKLIST

(Physical Inspection Required)

Note: This checklist includes provisions for where Rugby League matches are played. In situations where matches are not being played, some of these requirements will not be applicable and such questions should be marked "Not Applicable".

Playing Arena / Equipment	Yes	No
Does the ground meet the requirements for participation in Rugby League?		
Is the surface free of debris?		
Have weather conditions or water made participation unsafe (ground conditions or other reasons)?		
Is the surface in good condition i.e. grass appropriate length, free of holes etc.?		
Are sprinkler covers correctly in place?		
Are lighting conditions adequate?		
Are ground markings safe and a sufficient distance from fencing and other structures?		
Is sports equipment safe and in good condition e.g. footballs correctly inflated?		
Check goal post pads and corner posts are in place and secured as per regulations		
Check on field seating (bench) for team reserves and support staff		
Check that bins containing soil or sand are positioned at half way on both sides of ground		
Check sin-bin officials, timekeepers have appropriate area set aside		
Check siren/bell is in working order		
Is protective equipment provided and in good condition?		
Check field markings are as per ARL Guidelines		
Ensure water is available near playing area for filling of water bottles		
General Facilities (including Grandstands)	Yes	No
Are the facilities free of debris?		
Is seating clean and safe?		
Check safety of any portable seating or scaffolding which has been erected		
Change Room Facilities	Yes	No
Are the change rooms & referees facilities safe and hygienically clean, particularly showers and toilets?		
Check hot water for shower facilities in player & referees rooms		
Check supply of ice		
Check supply of drinking water and/or soft drinks for both competing teams and referees rooms		
Are benches and tables provided and in safe condition?		
Are toilets well maintained, hygienic and adequately stocked?

First Aid	Yes	No
Is a qualified first aid attendant on site?		
Is a stretcher provided on site?		
Is the stretcher location known to teams involved?		
Is a qualified first aid officer present?		
Is a telephone available for emergency use, together with emergency numbers being known?		
Have first aid kit stocks been checked against an appropriate check list, with ice available?		
Is an ambulance present at the venue while the match is in progress with clear access to arena?		
Check sterile medical area is provided for doctor		
Do First Aid Officers know the location of the nearest hospital and medical centre?		

Note:

This checklist should be continually reviewed to ensure that it addresses all risk exposures for participation in Development Clinics, School Visits and other excursions. All amendments to documentation must be referred to ARL Risk Manager.
